In The Presence of God

When we come into the presence of God may we truly worship him and may we leave with a rich blessing for having done so.

Minister's Message

Worship That Pleases Jehovah

In The Presence Of God

Habakkuk wrote, "But the Lord in His holy temple, let all the earth keep silence before Him" (2:20). A very large part of our Christian life is devoted to the worship of God. While most disciples understand their duties to attend the assemblies of the church, it is evident that many do not have a clear understanding of the meaning and manner of worship. We do not assemble just to SING!! We are there to worship God with our praise. Some love singing, even as they love eating or football. They just happen to love singing gospel songs. They sing for personal pleasure. Worship for them is of small importance. Just singing a religious song does not constitute worship, or else every country band that sings "I'll Fly Away" in a concert is worshiping God; every Dixieland band that performs "When The Saints Go Marching In" is worshiping. When we worship in song we are praising and adoring God. We are teaching and admonishing one another (Col. 3:16). It is a sacrifice of praise offered to God, through Christ (Heb 13:15) and done in spirit and in truth (John 4:24). Entertainment is not a consideration when we are worshiping God. When it comes to praise worship, only the good music which opens the mind to Christian teaching and disposes the soul to holy thoughts. Music without words cannot do that; so instrumental music is excluded from public worship."


When we are assembled to worship, it is not the time to attempt to sing a song that is unknown to the song leader of the congregation. It is not the time to practice songs not well known to the congregation, or tackle difficult songs that the leader cannot handle. So, tragically the leader might hinder and even defeat the worship of the people. All this places a heavy responsibility on those who have the privilege to lead in this aspect of our worship.

They Stayed On

A small party of missionaries were invited to go to Tibet at a time when missionary activity was forbidden there. They were told their task was to help stem the tide of a plague that was raging out of control. When the plague was over, the government asked the missionaries to leave. But these servants of Christ felt a responsibility to minister to the souls of the Tibetans as well as to their bodies. The authorities threatened to kill them, but the fear of death did not deter them from their purpose. They stayed on.

One night the Tibetans encircled their house with flaming torches. They began dancing around in a wide circle, ever diminishing in size seeking to achieve their aim of setting the place ablaze. The missionaries fell to their knees in prayer, and became so intent as the wild chanting came closer that they never realized it had ceased. When they arose, the mob had dispersed, and they were allowed to remain. Years later, one of their converts told them that he had been in the circle, and they had every intention of burning the missionaries to death in their house. However, as they approached the dwelling, there stood before the door a figure in white apparel holding a flaming sword. They fled in fright. And thus the door was opened for the gospel in Tibet, because God honored the faith of those who were willing to die at any time for their Lord.

Happy Anniversary

Thou Shalt Worship The Lord Thy God

Jesus said "thou shalt worship the Lord thy God. And Him only shalt thou serve" (Matt. 4:10). Man's greatest privilege is to worship the Sovereign Creator of the Universe. No other earthly experience can equal worship. Men have fought and died for the freedom to worship. How much more to come into the presence of Jehovah?

Man's greatest **need** is to have communion and fellowship with God and that is precisely the purpose of worship. When the human heart is in sin it is separated from God, and darkness and despair hangs heavy over it (Isa. 59:1-2). When in acceptable worship, man the sinner, is allowed to approach the Father and receive a blessing (Luke 15:11-24). In Lord's Day worship we remember Christ's death in the Lord's Supper (1 Cor. 11:23-28); that is a communion, a participation with the Lord (1 Cor. 10:16). In our songs and prayers we converse with God (Ps. 34:1-6). Man without God in his life, is like a body without a spirit (James 2:26) But man in a proper relationship with God enjoys the abundant life (John 10:10).

Man's greatest **responsibility** is to worship God in an acceptable fashion. Jesus reminded the woman at the well that God seeks true worshipers who will worship him in spirit and in truth (John 4:23-24). Our worship must be according to the will of the Father to be acceptable (Matt. 7:21). The wise person will look to scripture to be sure that he is indeed serving God as he desires, especially in these times when numerous religions all profess to worship God.

Man's greatest **hope** is to live with God in eternity, which is the promised reward of faithful worshipers. If we want to be with the saved in that glorious worship assembly, then surely we must be among his worshipers now. In Revelation chapter 7, John foresaw the redeemed of all nations in heaven, worshiping God (7:5-11).
