James Inglis was a graduate of Edinburgh University, very learned and eloquent. He became the most popular preacher in Detroit, Michigan. Eager listeners would fill his church to overflowing. Startled, he answered, "I am preaching good theology." "I did not ask what you are preaching, but whom you are preaching." Inglis answered, "I am preaching the gospel." Again the voice said, "I did not ask you what you are preaching; I asked whom you are preaching." Silent, with bowed head, the preacher sat for a long time. Then rousing himself he cried, "O my God, I am preaching James Inglis, but henceforth I will preach Christ and Him crucified." Inglis went to a chest of drawers in his study, took his eloquent sermons from the files and burned them one by one. From that day he turned his back upon popularity and gave himself wholly to God's service by lifting Christ before men. God honored his consecration by giving him ever-widening influence. When we preach Christ and Him crucified we honor God and His Son Jesus. Romans 1:16 says not to be ashamed of the gospel for it is the power of God unto salvation to everyone that believes.

Minister's Message

Meaningful and Rewarding Worship (Part 3)

Worship That Builds Us Up

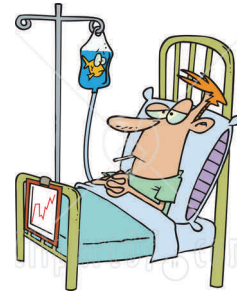
The primary reason for our church assemblies is to worship God. The most important factor of our worship is to be acceptable to God.

- For this to be, our worship must be according to His revealed will. Jesus said, “Not everyone that saith to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven; but he that doeth the will of my Father who is in heaven” (Matt. 7:21). Those who seek to serve Him in some other way will hear Him say, “I never knew you.” (&:23). Hebrews 8:5 says, we are to do all things according to the pattern revealed to us.
- In worship we should offer God our very best efforts. He has never accepted anything less than the best from those who approach Him Under the old law of Moses, no blemished sacrifice was acceptable (Lev. 22:21).
- Our worship should be worthy of being offered to Christ. Those who preach teach or lead in songs and prayers should **be prepared** for their task so they will do well in leading God’s people in worship. Never should worship be treated in a foolish and careless way. The God of creation is worthy of our best efforts.
- Our worship should be a teaching experience so that all who come will have something spiritually valuable to take home with them (1 Cor. 14:9, 24-25).
- Our worship should be conducted in such a way that our visitors will see the beauty of biblically based divine worship. Think back over your experiences in worship. When services are well led, our hearts and souls are lifted up and inspired. When they are poorly done, then we are uninspired as a result. The average visitor with a denominational background will be impressed with our a’cappella singing, our weekly communion, and our lack of ritual of clergy. But the visitor should not be impressed with a casual attitude, poor singing, and lack of preparation or our lack of reverence to God.
- It is essential that our worship activities edify those who participate. The word “edify” means to build up, to encourage, to strengthen (1Cor. 14:26). A prayer can edify only if it can be heard and if it reflects the needs of those being led. Songs only edify when the worshipers **know the song** and **when they are pitched** and led properly. Sermons that are boring, rambling and disconnected cannot edify, nor can those that are filled with jokes, trivia and very little scripture.

Remember, the way we conduct our worship conveys a lesson to our visitors, just as powerfully as our sermon. That lesson should always be positive, constructive and above all else Scriptural. Let us always give our best to the master.

Happy Anniversary

Thou Shalt Worship The Lord Thy God

Jesus said "thou shalt worship the Lord thy God. And Him only shalt thou serve" (Matt. 4:10). Man's greatest privilege is to worship the Sovereign Creator of the Universe. No other earthly experience can equal worship. Men have fought and died for the freedom to worship. How much more to come into the presence of Jehovah?

Man's greatest *need* is to have communion and fellowship with God and that is precisely the purpose of worship. When the human heart is in sin it is separated from God, and darkness and despair hangs heavy over it (Isa. 59:1-2). When in acceptable worship, man the sinner, is allowed to approach the Father and receive a blessing (Luke 15:11-24). In Lord's Day worship we remember Christ's death in the Lord's Supper (1 Cor. 11:23-28); that is a communion, a participation with the Lord (1 Cor. 10:16). In our songs and prayers we converse with God (Ps. 34:1-6). Man without God in his life, is like a body without a spirit (James 2:26) But man in a proper relationship with God enjoys the abundant life (John 10:10).

Man's greatest *responsibility* is to worship God in an acceptable fashion. Jesus reminded the woman at the well that God seeks true worshipers who will worship him in spirit and in truth (John 4:23-24). Our worship must be according to the will of the Father to be acceptable (Matt. 7:21). The wise person will look to scripture to be sure that he is indeed serving God as he desires, especially in these times when numerous religions all profess to worship God.

Man's greatest *hope* is to live with God in eternity, which is the promised reward of faithful worshipers. If we want to be with the saved in that glorious worship assembly, then surely we must be among his worshipers now. In Revelation chapter 7, John foresaw the redeemed of all nations in heaven, worshipping God (7:5-11).
